

We received quite a variety of items from baby blankets, preemie hats, baby hats, and baby booties to hats, scarves, and mittens. A few helmet liners also came in. Remember: December will be the last month for collecting the helmet liners. Thank you all again for your hard work.

So far this year, we have collected 316 items just for the Rochester Library's Bundle Up with a Good Book project alone! See the itemized list below. At the November meeting, Shelley Matthews shared stories about the appreciative children that you have helped keep warm over the past 5 years.



Through your support we have donated 2379 hand knit items over the past 5 years. Our December meeting will be the last chance for you to get those school aged size mittens and gently used books in for this effort. Thank you for your ongoing support!

In our continuing efforts to spread the warmth, we have a few places that we will be sending your donations this month. Of course, Friends of Strong and other hospitals in the area will continue to receive baby and preemie items. Also, the Monroe County Crime Lab has started a couple of drives. One is a breakfast with Santa for the Boys and Girls Club, where each child will receive a gift as they have breakfast with Jolly St. Nick. The second is for the Open Door Mission. They welcome articles of clothing for all ages—hats, mittens, scarves, sweaters, socks and even personal items like washcloths and towels if anyone is in the mood to knit up some of those. 

## Summary of Fiscal Review of FY2010-2011

I conducted a fiscal review of the financial records of the Rochester Knitting Guild for fiscal year 7/1/2010 – 6/30/2011. The guild keeps its financial records on a cash basis. The review included a follow-up on findings/recommendations made in the prior year's fiscal review. The checkbook register, HSBC bank statement, and 2010 – 2011 RKG Financial Statement were consistent with a year-end (6/30/2011) cash amount available of \$10,750.57. Most recommendations made for the prior period were implemented. Documentation procedures for revenue and expenses had improved; additional recommendations regarding documentation, including labeling of budget categories, were made. The revenue tally sheet created by the Treasurer for monthly membership was recommended as a format that could be used for all revenue "events."




