Member Shop Shout Out

A longstanding member shop, **Miki Mand*Fibres**, will be closing its doors at the end of this year. Miki has many personal demands, and has decided she can no longer keep her business running properly. Miki's shop is in her home on South Goodman Street and is easily accessible. Her shop area is filled with mostly natural fibers from Drop Spindle. Miki offers a 25% discount on yarn and 10% on books, etc. If you have a tax exempt id, she will give a 40% discount. From now until she closes she is accepting cash only. Nearly everything in her store is natural fibers. She carries non-pre-packaged wools, silks, cottons, and also skeins and cones. Much of what she carries is good for machine knitting. Call her to arrange a time to come by and see what she has to offer. She is friendly and accommodating and will tell you over the phone if she has something specific you are looking for.

If you are interested in a day trip while the leaves are still colorful, **Finger Lakes Fibers** is an easy (and gorgeous) drive down Route 14 to (the quaint main street of) Watkins Glen. Walking in the door one is immediately struck by the colors in wall cubbies waiting to be caressed. We knew ahead of time that FLF carried Schaefer yarns, but were pleasantly unprepared to see such a variety of Cascade yarns -- gorgeous yarns of all weights, fibers and colors. The shop was preparing for a Cascade yarn tasting and so their stock was at a peak (also peeking from baskets and bins.) The staff welcomed us like old friends, and we poked around for considerable time before making our purchases.

The meeting this month will feature a program by Melissa Leapman. She is a very talented knitter, and author of 15 books. We have such a large selection of classes to enjoy, and then we get to finish her visit with a wonderful lecture and take a look at some of her designs. I'm really looking forward to meeting her.

Now for an update on my progress with The Knitting Guild of America Masters Program. Making myself accountable to you all is starting to work. So I have now pulled out my folder and seen how far I got before I put everything in a holding zone. I made the first three swatches. The first three swatches are K2P2 ribbing with Garter stitch, K1P1 ribbing with Stockinette stitch, and seed stitch. So far so good, my goal will be to knit more swatches (or at least three) in time for the next newsletter article. They are very particular about how they want these done, certain yarn, each swatch needs to be worked a very specific way. Then you need to put together a folder with all your swatches neatly placed inside with lots of descriptions. I'm not the most diligent with detail things like this, but when forced to I'm up to the task.

Let us welcome the (over 50) new members that have joined our guild since September! (They sport yellow ribbons on their nametags.)
