Jogless Jog

Working stripes in the round causes a mismatch at the start/end point because circular knitting is a spiral and not a tube.

SLIPPED STITCHES



What is a slip stitch?

A slip stitch is any time a stitch is moved from one needle to the other without working it. This elongates the slip stitch and makes it more prominent in the design. The slip stitch may be either a knit or a purl.

Some Common Terms and Abbreviations:

WYIB: With Yarn in Back
Slip the stitch with the working yarn to the back

WYIF: With Yarn in Front
Slip the stitch with the working yarn to the front


YF: Yarn Forward

Bring working yarn in between needles to front of work

YB: Yarn Back
Bring working yarn in between needles to back of work


Long areas of plain Garter alternate with bands of mosaic patterns.

Epilogue YOU SURVIVED!

Classic Ball Band Dishcloth 2 Colors, MC and CC Slip all stitches purlwise!

With CC, CO 45 sts.

Row 1 (RS): Using CC, knit. Row 2 (WS): With CC Purl

Row 3: Join MC, k4, sl 1 wyib, *k5, sl1 wyib; rep from * to last 4 sts, k4.

Row 4: With MC K4, yf, sl 1 wyif, yb, *k5, yf, sl 1 wyif, yb; rep from * to 4 sts before m, k4, slip m, with CC k4.

Row 5: With MC p4, yb, sl 1 wyib, yf, *p5, yb, sl 1 wyib, yf; rep from * to last 4 sts, p4.

Row 6: Repeat Row 4.

Row 7: With CC, knit.

Row 8: With CC, purl.

Row 9: With MC k1, sl 1 wyib, *k5, sl 1 wyib; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 10: With MC K1, yf, sl 1 wyif, yb, *k5, yf, sl 1wyif, yb; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 11: With MC p1, yb, sl 1 wyib, yf, *p5, yb, sl 1 wyib, yf; rep from * to last st, p1.

Row 12: Repeat Row 10.

Repeat Rows 1-12 a total of 5 times, then Rows 1-8 only. Bind off loosely.
