Save the Dates!! The RKG Spring Workshops featuring *Colorwork Around the World* are scheduled for April 26, 27 and 28, 2024 via Zoom.

Our Spring Workshop classes will feature colorwork techniques from The Shetlands with Janette Budge and from Scandinavia with Kristin Drysdale, and will offer options for introductory level as well as more adventurous level classes. Kristin will be our featured speaker at the March 11, 2024 Guild meeting, to present "Scandinavian Knitting Traditions and Symbolism in Nordic Knitting " and Janette will present a talk on "Knitting and Living in Shetland" at the April 8, 2024 meeting (both of those Guild meetings will be via Zoom).

The Shetland classes will take us from color selection (authentic Shetland and beyond) to final steeking. The Scandinavian classes will feature several different yarn and color management techniques and skills and also a Scandinavian Slipper class to put those skills to work!

Tips from the Help Desk

I love interchangeable needles, but even when they are tightened to the max, they still come untwisted, and then the stitches get stuck in the gap. If you have this problem (A), here's the solution:

Get dental wax (B), and pinch off a small piece. Roll it into a small cigar-like shape, and insert it into the female end of the cable or needle (C). Continue filling until the wax is even with the top (D). Then screw the needle tightly to the cable, and the problem should be solved.

Note: if you have too much wax, scrape the inside with a paper clip to remove the excess.
